1	(b) GOALIt is a goal of the United States to reduce by 40 percent the amount of foreign
2	oil projected to be imported during calendar year 2025 in the reference case contained in the
3	report of the Energy Information Administration entitled "Annual Energy Outlook 2005".
4	(c) MEASURES TO REDUCE IMPORT DEPENDENCE
5	(1) IN GENERALNot later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act,
6	and every two years thereafter, the President shall-
7	(A) develop and implement measures to reduce dependence on foreign
8	petroleum imports of the United States by reducing petroleum in end-uses
9	throughout the economy of the United States sufficient to reduce total demand for
10	petroleum in the United States by 1,000,000 barrels per day from the amount
11	projected for calendar year 2015; and
12	(B)(i) subject to clause (ii), develop and implement measures to reduce
13	dependence on foreign petroleum imports of the United States by reducing
14	petroleum in end-uses throughout the economy of the United States sufficient to
15	reduce total demand for petroleum in the United States by 7,640,000 barrels per
16	day from the amount projected for calendar year 2025.
17	(ii) If the President determines that there are insufficient legal authorities
18	to achieve the target for calendar year 2025 in clause (i), the President shall
19	develop and implement measures that will reduce dependence on foreign
20	petroleum imports of the United States by reducing petroleum in end-uses
21	throughout the economy of the United States to the maximum extent practicable
22	and shall submit to Congress proposed legislation or other recommendations to

1	achieve the target.
2	(2) REQUIREMENTS.—In developing measures under paragraph (1), the
3	President shall—
4	(A) ensure continued reliable and affordable energy for the United States,
5	consistent with the creation of jobs and economic growth and maintaining the
6	international competitiveness of United States businesses, including the manufacturing
7	sector; and
8	(B) implement measures under paragraph (1) under existing authorities of the
9	appropriate Federal agencies, as determined by the President.
10	(3) PROJECTIONSThe projections for total demand for petroleum in the United
11	States under paragraph (1) shall be those contained in the Reference Case in the report of
12	the Energy Information Administration entitled "Annual Energy Outlook 2005".
13	(d) REPORT
14	(1) IN GENERALNot later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act,
15	and annually thereafter, the President shall submit to Congress a report, based on the most
16	recent edition of the Annual Energy Outlook published by the Energy Information
17	Administration, assessing the progress made by the United States toward the goal of
18	reducing dependence on imported petroleum sources by 2025.
19	(2) CONTENTS.—The report under paragraph (1) shall—
20	(A) identify the status of efforts to meet the goal described in subsection
21	(b);
22	(B) assess the effectiveness of any measure implemented under subsection
23	(c) during the previous fiscal year in meeting the goal described in subsection (b);

(C) describe plans to develop additional measures to meet the goal.
