3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Commission to Study
5	the Potential Creation of a National Women's History
6	Museum Act''.
7	SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
8	In this Act:
9	(1) Commission.—The term "Commission"
10	means the Commission to Study the Potential Cre-

1	ation of a National Women's History Museum estab-
2	lished by section 3(a).
3	(2) Museum.—The term "Museum" means the
4	National Women's History Museum.
5	SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION.
6	(a) In General.—There is established the Commis-
7	sion to Study the Potential Creation of a National Wom-
8	en's History Museum.
9	(b) Membership.—The Commission shall be com-
10	posed of 8 members, of whom—
11	(1) 2 members shall be appointed by the major-
12	ity leader of the Senate;
13	(2) 2 members shall be appointed by the Speak-
14	er of the House of Representatives;
15	(3) 2 members shall be appointed by the minor-
16	ity leader of the Senate; and
17	(4) 2 members shall be appointed by the minor-
18	ity leader of the House of Representatives.
19	(c) QUALIFICATIONS.—Members of the Commission
20	shall be appointed to the Commission from among individ-
21	uals, or representatives of institutions or entities, who pos-
22	sess—
23	(1)(A) a demonstrated commitment to the re-
24	search, study, or promotion of women's history, art,
25	political or economic status, or culture; and

1	(B)(i) expertise in museum administration;
2	(ii) expertise in fundraising for nonprofit or cul-
3	tural institutions;
4	(iii) experience in the study and teaching of
5	women's history;
6	(iv) experience in studying the issue of the rep-
7	resentation of women in art, life, history, and cul-
8	ture at the Smithsonian Institution;
9	(v) extensive experience in public or elected
10	service; or
11	(vi) experience as a professional historian with
12	expertise in women's history;
13	(2) experience in the administration of, or the
14	planning for, the establishment of, museums; or
15	(3) experience in the planning, design, or con-
16	struction of museum facilities.
17	(d) Prohibition.—No employee of the Federal Gov-
18	ernment may serve as a member of the Commission.
19	(e) Deadline for Initial Appointment.—The
20	initial members of the Commission shall be appointed not
21	later than the date that is 90 days after the date of enact-
22	ment of this Act.
23	(f) Vacancies.—A vacancy in the Commission—
24	(1) shall not affect the powers of the Commis-
25	sion; and

1	(2) shall be filled in the same manner as the
2	original appointment was made.
3	(g) Chairperson.—The Commission shall, by ma-
4	jority vote of all of the members, select 1 member of the
5	Commission to serve as the Chairperson of the Commis-
6	sion.
7	SEC. 4. DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION.
8	(a) Reports.—
9	(1) Plan of action.—The Commission shall
10	submit to the President and Congress a report con-
11	taining the recommendations of the Commission
12	with respect to a plan of action for the establishment
13	and maintenance of a National Women's History
14	Museum in Washington, DC.
15	(2) Report on issues.—The Commission shall
16	submit to the President and Congress a report that
17	addresses the following issues:
18	(A) The availability and cost of collections
19	to be acquired and housed in the Museum.
20	(B) The impact of the Museum on regional
21	women history-related museums.
22	(C) Potential locations for the Museum in
23	Washington, DC, and its environs.
24	(D) Whether the Museum should be part
25	of the Smithsonian Institution.

1	(E) The governance and organizational
2	structure from which the Museum should oper-
3	ate.
4	(F) Best practices for engaging women in
5	the development and design of the Museum.
6	(G) The cost of constructing, operating,
7	and maintaining the Museum.
8	(3) Deadline.—The reports required under
9	paragraphs (1) and (2) shall be submitted not later
10	than the date that is 18 months after the date of
11	the first meeting of the Commission.
12	(b) Fundraising Plan.—
13	(1) In General.—The Commission shall de-
14	velop a fundraising plan to support the establish-
15	ment, operation, and maintenance of the Museum
16	through contributions from the public.
17	(2) Considerations.—In developing the fund-
18	raising plan under paragraph (1), the Commission
19	shall consider—
20	(A) the role of the National Women's His-
21	tory Museum (a nonprofit, educational organi-
22	zation described in section 501(c)(3) of the In-
23	ternal Revenue Code of 1986 that was incor-
24	porated in 1996 in Washington, DC, and dedi-
25	cated for the purpose of establishing a women's

1	history museum) in raising funds for the con-
2	struction of the Museum; and
3	(B) issues relating to funding the oper-
4	ations and maintenance of the Museum in per-
5	petuity without reliance on appropriations of
6	Federal funds.
7	(3) Independent review.—The Commission
8	shall obtain an independent review of the viability of
9	the plan developed under paragraph (1) and such re-
10	view shall include an analysis as to whether the plan
11	is likely to achieve the level of resources necessary
12	to fund the construction of the Museum and the op-
13	erations and maintenance of the Museum in per-
14	petuity without reliance on appropriations of Federal
15	funds.
16	(4) Submission.—The Commission shall sub-
17	mit the plan developed under paragraph (1) and the
18	review conducted under paragraph (3) to the Com-
19	mittees on Transportation and Infrastructure,
20	House Administration, Natural Resources, and Ap-
21	propriations of the House of Representatives and the
22	Committees on Rules and Administration, Energy
23	and Natural Resources, and Appropriations of the
24	Senate.

1	(c) LEGISLATION TO CARRY OUT PLAN OF AC-
2	TION.—Based on the recommendations contained in the
3	report submitted under paragraphs (1) and (2) of sub-
4	section (a), the Commission shall submit for consideration
5	to the Committees on Transportation and Infrastructure,
6	House Administration, Natural Resources, and Appropria-
7	tions of the House of Representatives and the Committees
8	on Rules and Administration, Energy and Natural Re-
9	sources, and Appropriations of the Senate recommenda-
10	tions for a legislative plan of action to establish and con-
11	struct the Museum.
12	(d) National Conference.—Not later than 18
13	months after the date on which the initial members of the
14	Commission are appointed under section 3, the Commis-
15	sion may, in carrying out the duties of the Commission
16	under this section, convene a national conference relating
17	to the Museum, to be comprised of individuals committed
18	to the advancement of the life, art, history, and culture
19	of women.
20	SEC. 5. DIRECTOR AND STAFF OF COMMISSION.
21	(a) Director and Staff.—
22	(1) In General.—The Commission may em-
23	ploy and compensate an executive director and any
24	other additional personnel that are necessary to en-

1	able the Commission to perform the duties of the
2	Commission.
3	(2) Rates of pay for persons
4	employed under paragraph (1) shall be consistent
5	with the rates of pay allowed for employees of a tem-
6	porary organization under section 3161 of title 5,
7	United States Code.
8	(b) Not Federal Employment.—Any individual
9	employed under this Act shall not be considered a Federal
10	employee for the purpose of any law governing Federal
11	employment.
12	(c) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE.—
13	(1) In general.—Subject to paragraph (2), on
14	request of the Commission, the head of a Federal
15	agency may provide technical assistance to the Com-
16	mission.
17	(2) Prohibition.—No Federal employees may
18	be detailed to the Commission.
19	SEC. 6. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.
20	(a) Compensation.—
21	(1) In general.—A member of the Commis-
22	sion—
23	(A) shall not be considered to be a Federal
24	employee for any purpose by reason of service
25	on the Commission; and

(B) shall serve without pay.
(2) Travel expenses.—A member of the
Commission shall be allowed a per diem allowance
for travel expenses, at rates consistent with those
authorized under subchapter I of chapter 57 of title
5, United States Code.
(b) Gifts, Bequests, Devises.—The Commission
may solicit, accept, use, and dispose of gifts, bequests, or
devises of money, services, or real or personal property for
the purpose of aiding or facilitating the work of the Com-
mission.
(c) Federal Advisory Committee Act.—The
Commission shall not be subject to the Federal Advisory
Committee Act (5 U.S.C. App.).
SEC. 7. TERMINATION.
The Commission shall terminate on the date that is
30 days after the date on which the final versions of the
reports required under section 4(a) are submitted.
SEC. 8. FUNDING.
(a) In General.—The Commission shall be solely
responsible for acceptance of contributions for, and pay-
ment of the expenses of, the Commission.

(b) Prohibition.—No Federal funds may be obli-
