TESTIMONY OF COSTCO

Good morning, Mr. Chairman and Committee Members.

My name is Rob Leuck. I am a vice president for Costco Wholesale Corporation, the second largest retailer by sales in the United States. I have responsibility for 20 locations in the northeast United States, including the Costco in Colchester, Vermont. I am including with my written testimony some background information about Costco wholesale. Our Colchester warehouse currently provides 279 good paying jobs with generous health and other benefits. Over 130,000 Vermont residents have a Costco card which accounts for approximately 20% of all Vermont residents.

Our business model is centered on high volume, no-frills facilities operating with low overhead so that we are able to provide tremendous value for our members. Wherever it is practical, Costco operates gasoline stations at our Costco warehouses. We consider gasoline to be one of our core services. Our philosophy is simple: Our members pay to shop with us, and we strive to provide a suite of products that provide great value for that membership fee. Gasoline is one such product.

While we, of course, will always strive to provide the best possible price, we are also committed to providing the highest possible quality on gas. As an example, we now offer gasoline with 5 -times the EPA required detergent dose. This assures our members that their engines will receive enough detergent to remove deposits from intake valves and injectors, so that they can run at peak efficiency. We call that "doing the right thing." This detergent program is currently available at over 200 US Costco sites and will be available at all Costco locations by September of 2013.

Costco's policy concerning gasoline pricing is simple: we will not be undersold by competitors in our market areas. Because our members pay to shop at Costco, it is critical that we show them consistently good value. The chart attached to this document is a snapshot of the value being offered at sites that I manage for Costco.

We have read that some of our competitors believe we sell gasoline as a "loss leader." That is simply not the case. Sometimes meeting the competition means that -- where it is lawful to do so -- we sell below our cost, usually on a temporary basis. We will not, however, sell below cost <u>unless</u> meeting competition requires us to do so and it is legally permitted. In such circumstances, we would only lower prices to "meet" the competition and not "beat" it.

Additionally, we operate all our gas stations in a responsible manner, and implement and maintain environmental and safety measures that meet, and often exceed industry and legal requirements. Every business a member encounters in a Costco, from optical, to pharmacy to gasoline, is there to provide a great value for our members: that includes great pricing, great quality and great service. We have been trying for more than 4 years to obtain approval for Costco gas station in Colchester but we have faced opposition from competitors. We will not be deterred, and will continue to try to obtain approval so we can provide this important core service to our Vermont members.

We face vigorous competition from competitors large and small in nearly every Major market in the United States and Canada. Ultimately, competition serves the needs of the community--Costco members and nonmembers alike. In the absence of our type of competition, markets typically charge what the market will bear. Our model is different, in that, as we are able, we seek to maximize sales by providing the lowest possible prices on all of the items we sell. Based on our experience throughout the United States, we believe Costco gas station at the Colchester site would serve the entire community by lowering the opening price point and reducing the average price paid for gasoline at all nearby outlets.

We have included some information about our recent gas station opening in Maui, Hawaii, which demonstrates how our entering a market positively influences the prices paid for gas in that community, not just at the Costco, but across the island.

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The entrance to the station is on the Paia side of Costco's Haleakala Highway entrance. The station is open 6 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. Monday to Friday, and 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays.

The Kahului operation adds to five other gas stations in Hawaii three on Oahu, and one each on Kauai and the Big Island.

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Maui Costco Gas Opens at Low \$3.99

Costco Wholesale on Maui opened a gas station this morning, selling regular unleaded gas at \$3.99 and premium for \$4.19 for a gallon.

The price is at least 30 cents lower than prices offered at other Kahului gas stations today.

Stations such as Chevron on Ka'ahumanu Avenue and 76 on Wakea Avenue were selling gas today at \$4.29 for a gallon of regular. That's below prices reported in recent weeks.

The average price of gas in Wailuku has dropped 55 cents since last month from \$4.869, to \$4.318, according to the AAA Daily Fuel Gauge Report.

The same report shows the drop in gas prices of 22 cents since last week in the days leading up to the Costco Gas opening.

Jeff Cole, Vice President of Costco Wholesale stated that so far, the opening has been met with "nothing but excitement."

A blessing event marking the opening was attended by Maui Mayor Alan Arakawa this morning. He was the second in line behind a 93-year-old, long time Costco customer.

To fill up gas at the new Costco station, customers must be members at the Wholesale retailer.

Costco now has six gas stations in Hawai'i: three on O'ahu, one in Kona, one in Kauai and the newest addition on Maui.

Aside from the low price, another benefit to filling up, officials say is an added cleaning agent in the gas which helps to keep engines of customer cars running smoothly.

Jeff Cole, national vice president of Costco Wholesale said he is not certain how the low prices will impact other stations on the island, but he said, "Our commitment is to our customer base."

He said the Maui gas station has been a long time coming and has been a topic of discussion for over ten years.

While the opening of the new gas station was widely anticipated, so is the expansion of the Costco warehouse on Maui.

Jaime Havron, general manager of Costco on Maui said that they will be expanding to add another 20,000 sq ft. to the Kahuhui location.

Havron says that there will be many surprises for the people of Maui such as an expanded refigeration section and moving the food court to an outside setting.

The expansion is expected to be completed by the second week of November, in time for Thanksgiving and the holidays.
