- Road, Baker Ranch Road, South Desert Overlook Road, Temple of the Sun and Moon Road, Gypsum Sinkhole Road, and Sulphur Creek Road that are located within the boundaries of the Capitol Reef National Park in the State.
- 6 (2) Off-highway vehicle.—The term "off-7 highway vehicle" has the meaning given the term in 8 State law.
- 9 (3) STATE.—The term "State" means the State of Utah.
- 11 (b) APPLICABLE LAW.—State law shall apply to the 12 use of motor vehicles (including off-highway vehicles) on 13 a covered road.
