3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Fort Sumter and Fort

5 Moultrie National Historical Park Act of 2018”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 In this Act:

8 (1) MAP.—The term “map” means the map en-

9 titled “Boundary Map, Fort Sumter and Fort

10 Moultrie National Historical Park”, numbered 392/

11 80,088, and dated August 2009.

1 (2) PARK.—The term “Park” means the Fort
2 Sumter and Fort Moultrie National Historical Park
3 established by section 3(a).

4 (3) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
5 the Secretary of the Interior.

6 (4) STATE.—The term “State” means the State
7 of South Carolina.

8 (5) SULLIVAN’S ISLAND LIFE SAVING STATION
9 HISTORIC DISTRICT.—The term “Sullivan’s Island
10 Life Saving Station Historic District” means the
11 Charleston Lighthouse, the boathouse, garage, bunk-
12 er/sighting station, signal tower, and any associated
13 land and improvements to the land that are located
14 between Sullivan’s Island Life Saving Station and
15 the mean low water mark.

16 **SEC. 3. FORT SUMTER AND FORT MOULTRIE NATIONAL**
17 **HISTORICAL PARK.**

18 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established the Fort
19 Sumter and Fort Moultrie National Historical Park in the
20 State as a single unit of the National Park System to pre-
21 serve, maintain, and interpret the nationally significant
22 historical values and cultural resources associated with
23 Fort Sumter National Monument, Fort Moultrie National
24 Monument, and the Sullivan’s Island Life Saving Station
25 Historic District.

1 (b) BOUNDARY.—The boundary of the Park shall be
2 as generally depicted on the map.

3 (c) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on file
4 and available for public inspection in the appropriate of-
5 fices of the National Park Service.

6 (d) ADMINISTRATION.—

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary, acting
8 through the Director of the National Park Service,
9 shall administer the Park in accordance with this
10 Act and the laws generally applicable to units of the
11 National Park System, including—

12 (A) section 100101(a), chapter 1003, and
13 sections 100751(a), 100752, 100753, and
14 102101 of title 54, United States Code; and

15 (B) chapter 3201 of title 54, United States
16 Code.

17 (2) INTERPRETATION OF HISTORICAL
18 EVENTS.—The Secretary shall provide for the inter-
19 pretation of historical events and activities that oc-
20 curred in the vicinity of Fort Sumter and Fort
21 Moultrie, including—

22 (A) the Battle of Sullivan’s Island on June
23 28, 1776;

24 (B) the Siege of Charleston during 1780;

25 (C) the Civil War, including—

1 (i) the bombardment of Fort Sumter
2 by Confederate forces on April 12, 1861;
3 and

4 (ii) any other events of the Civil War
5 that are associated with Fort Sumter and
6 Fort Moultrie;

7 (D) the development of the coastal defense
8 system of the United States during the period
9 from the Revolutionary War to World War II,
10 including—

11 (i) the Sullivan’s Island Life Saving
12 Station;

13 (ii) the lighthouse associated with the
14 Sullivan’s Island Life Saving Station; and

15 (iii) the coastal defense sites con-
16 structed during the period of fortification
17 construction from 1898 to 1942, known as
18 the “Endicott Period”; and

19 (E) the lives of—

20 (i) the free and enslaved workers who
21 built and maintained Fort Sumter and
22 Fort Moultrie;

23 (ii) the soldiers who defended the
24 forts;

1 (iii) the prisoners held at the forts;

2 and

3 (iv) captive Africans bound for slavery

4 who, after first landing in the United

5 States, were brought to quarantine houses

6 in the vicinity of Fort Moultrie in the 18th

7 century, if the Secretary determines that

8 the quarantine houses and associated his-

9 torical values are nationally significant.

10 (e) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—The Secretary

11 may enter into cooperative agreements with public and

12 private entities and individuals to carry out this Act.

13 **SEC. 4. REPEAL OF EXISTING LAW.**

14 Section 2 of the Joint Resolution entitled “Joint Res-

15 olution to establish the Fort Sumter National Monument

16 in the State of South Carolina”, approved April 28, 1948

17 (16 U.S.C. 450ee–1), is repealed.
